
There are several beautiful tracks and trails in and around our resort that you can explore.


Blyde Canyon Adventure Centre

Within the expansive Blyde Canyon Nature Reserve, diverse wildlife freely wanders throughout this natural sanctuary. Visitors may encounter Vervet Monkeys, Chacma Baboons, Klipspringers, Common Duikers, Bushbucks, lesser and thick-tailed Bushbabies, Dassies (Rock Hyraxes), Scrub Hares and Small-spotted Genets. Explore this pristine wilderness through Guided Boat Tours, thrilling Quad Bike trails, breathtaking Air Adventures, or peaceful Canoeing experiences.

Three Rondavels

Along with Bourke's Luck Potholes, the Three Rondavels are one of the major icons of the Mpumalanga Province and situated on the Panorama Route. The Three Rondavels are three round mountain tops with slightly pointed tops, very similar to the traditional round or oval African homesteads made with local materials called rondavels.

Pinnacle Rock

The Pinnacle Rock is a huge quartz rock that shoots up from the ground, reaching about 30 meters high. This standalone rock towers over the thick natural forest of Driekop Gorge, showing off nature's odd creations and the special beauty of South Africa.



Berlin Falls

These falls tumble down in a single drop for some 80 metres, or about 260 feet, before crashing dramatically into a round basin that is an irresistible jade colour. Seeing the green waters set off by the red cliffs around them is something quite unforgettable and is best enjoyed from the observation platform above.

Mac Mac Falls

The Mac Mac Falls stands as the crown jewel of The Sabie Waterfalls Route, making it an essential stop for visitors. Sabie boasts the highest concentration of waterfalls in southern Africa, and Mac Mac Falls is widely considered the most spectacular among them. Its twin cascades dramatically plunge approximately 70 meters into the deep gorge below, creating a breathtaking natural display.
